My grandmother, Lenna Belle, whom I was named after, was a worrier. She had a rough life, married to a coal miner who was killed in a mine collapse leaving her with three kids under six years old. She went back to school and became a schoolteacher. She lived through the flu pandemic and the Depression. She dealt with my dad who served in WWII, and she finally died of a stroke in her 70's.

Sadly, she worried about everything, likely because of her life experience which didn't include church. But she did instill a great work ethic and close family ties. So, whenever I talk to a worrier or when I am worried, I think of Gramma and how much of life and joy she missed by worrying instead of praying, by worrying instead of being grateful.

I think Jesus was trying to teach his disciples how to deal with anxiety and worry. Look at Matthew 6:34 and Philippians 4:6-7.

No matter how many days God gives us, we are only given one day at a time. So, when you think about it, today is all we have. It's one of the facts of life. Yesterday is gone. Today is the only day you are sure of. No matter how many days God gives us, we receive them one at a time .

It reminds me of an old song, "One Day at a Time" (sung by Merle Haggard) \dots

Do you remember, when you walked among men?
Well Jesus, you know, if you're looking below, it's worse now than then.

One day at a time, sweet Jesus, that's all I'm asking of you.

Just give me the strength to do everything that I've got to do.

Yesterday's gone, sweet Jesus, and tomorrow may never be mine. Lord help me today, show me the way, one day at a time.




Spiritual Life of Our Congregation





Our worship services are <u>9:30 a.m.</u> Sundays, and we continue to follow the guidelines that have been enacted to curb the spread of the COVID-19 pandemic. This will continue for the foreseeable future until we receive further guidance. The worship service is streamed live on the church's Facebook page. While this service is live, it remains a saved file so you can watch the service as your schedule allows.





Bulletins are sent electronically via email (a few are printed and mailed). This will continue indefinitely. We encourage in-person worshippers to print their own bulletins, for safety reasons. An update from our mission at the Jicarilla Apache Reformed Church in New Mexico . . .

June 24, 2020

Dear Reformed Dutch Church,

Greetings from New Mexico! Our family remains under curfew and stay-at-home orders from the tribal nation. We are able to get outside a bit more lately, though, as the state parks have opened for day use. We've been kayaking and hiking, and we plan to continue to make use of the relatively nearby state parks. We are glad to have this opportunity!



The number of COVID-19 cases in Dulce continues to rise. All of our family have had a negative test in the past couple of

weeks. Please continue to pray that this disease doesn't overtake the local population here!

Only one Jicarilla Apache citizen has died so far, and that person didn't live on the reservation.

Pastor Brad continues to do some (physically distant) counseling, and he preaches via YouTube, as the tribe limits gatherings to five people. He has done four burial services since our quarantine started, none for COVID victims. We are also providing food for several local people who stop by. Many times, the act of feeding someone is accompanied by praying with that person, which we treasure. In addition, we have had some donations of cloth face coverings that we give away regularly. (If you are interested in sending some face masks our way, we would happily accept more!)

The ministers on the reservation and the tribal leadership have met to discuss reopening our churches, but with the infections in town still going up we anticipate virtual worship for at least several more weeks. We are all missing in-person worship, but we must keep people healthy.

We pray that you are well and managing the pandemic without difficulty. Having no mission groups this summer has been very odd for us. We miss you all!

FYI: Columbia County Community (NY Alert) Update:

Churches have been asked to notify their parishioners of an upcoming change to the emergency alert system known as NY Alert.

Recently, many of you have received a robocall from the Columbia County Code Red Emergency Alert System reminding you about the new <u>NY ALERT</u> system and the fact that Code Red will be discontinued.

If you have a landline, your phone number will be automatically transferred to the new system. If you use a cell phone, you will need to register your phone number.

County residents are advised to visit www.alert.ny.gov/enroll to register for NY ALERT cell phone and email alerts! Registration is now available to be prepared for the August 29 change. We're told it'll take you about 10 minutes to register your information.
