Happy Birthday to the Christian Church! (*May 23, 2021*) "When the day of Pentecost had come, they (the Apostles) were all together in one place. And suddenly a sound came from heaven like the rush of a mighty wind, and it filled all the house where they were sitting. And there appeared to them tongues as of fire, distributed and resting on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit..." (Acts 2:1-4)

The word Pentecost comes from the Greek word "pentecoste" (the 50th day). Pentecost (also called Whitsunday or White Sunday) derives from a Jewish festival called *Shavuot*. Primarily, Shavuot was a thanksgiving for the first fruits of the wheat harvest. Later, the Jewish people associated Shavuot with the remembrance of the Law given by God to Moses on Mt. Sinai.

The Apostles had gathered to observe this Jewish festival in a room ten days after Jesus' ascension into heaven – when suddenly a mighty wind (the Advocate) filled the room. Inspired by the Holy Spirit, the Apostles found themselves speaking in foreign languages.

To the early Christians until today, the observance of Pentecost was foretold in the Old Testament book of Joel (ch. 2:28-32) who prophesized, "and it shall be the last days that I shall pour out my Spirit on all folks."

Pentecost is an important part of our Christian calendar as it represents the beginning of the worldwide Christian church. The day of Pentecost fulfills Jesus' promise that the believing community will be guided and protected until His second coming – the Holy Spirit leading the Apostles, and us, through the trials and decisions that are daily presented when following and spreading the GOOD NEWS.

This year Pentecost will be observed Sunday, May 25th. Traditionally, many baptisms are administered and red is the color of the liturgical clothes and suggested to wear. (The color red, according to one tradition, represents the blood that Jesus shed for us and the blood that we and the church should be prepared to shed for Him.)

Every day in a year is marked by a celebration of Christ's life. Our observance of PENTECOST MARKS THE BE-GINNING OF OUR CHRISTIAN CALENDAR. PENTECOST IS NOT THE DAY THAT MAKES THE RIGHTEOUS, BUT THE BEGIN-NING OF THE FULL MINISTRY OF THE HOLY SPIRIT IN THE LIFE OF THE CHURCH, "our church".





They are created in a three-year cycle to cover many important Bible passages and meant as a teaching opportunity. Our church typically takes the readings from the New Revised Standard Version (NRSV) Bible.
